## NOTIFICATION

**The 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the transitional committee on the operationalization of the new funding arrangements for responding to loss and damage and the fund established in paragraph 3 of decisions 2/CP.27 and 2/CMA.4**

**29 August to 1 September 2023  
Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic**

I am pleased to notify Parties and observer States to the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement that the **3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the transitional committee on the operationalization of the new funding arrangements for responding to loss and damage and the fund established in paragraph 3 of decisions 2/CP.27 and 2/CMA.4** will take place from 29 August to 1 September 2023 in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, at the El Embajador, a Royal Hideaway Hotel.

In order to maximize progress during the meeting, it will include both open and closed components. These will be indicated in the provisional schedule, but revised as needed throughout the meeting. It is likely that the components of the meeting that are open to Parties, observer States and other non-Party observers will be kept to a minimum in order to maximize time for Transitional Committee deliberations at the meeting. Observers are encouraged to consider following the open components of the meeting virtually via the webcast. An overflow room will be made available for all in-person observers.

The UNFCCC focal points of interested Parties and observer States are requested to register for in-person attendance of the meeting via [TCsec@unfccc.int](mailto:TCsec@unfccc.int) by **Monday, 21 August 2023**. The secretariat may not be able to process observer registrations received after that deadline.
