The meetings will be open to observers in accordance with the above-mentioned decision. In accordance with decision 23/CP.18 and with a view to informing more effective climate change policy that addresses the needs of women and men equally, the UNFCCC secretariat encourages the nomination of women participants. Owing to space limitations, access may be limited for in-person participation. However, the meetings will be webcast through the UNFCCC website. Interested representatives of Parties and observer States should register for the meetings at here.

The deadline for registering as an observer for the meetings is 6 p.m. CEST on **Friday**, **30 August 2024**. In view of the need to confirm the arrangements for the meetings as early as possible, observer registrations received after this deadline may not be processed.

In-person participants are strongly encouraged to obtain comprehensive international medical insurance for the duration of their participation in the meeting. The United Nations and the UNFCCC secretariat disclaim all responsibility for medical, accident and travel insurance, for compensation for death or disability, for loss of or damage to personal property and for any other cost or loss that may be incurred during travel to or from the meeting or the period of participation.
