08:30 – 09:00	Welcome to Country ceremony A Welcome to Country is a traditional custom observed by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. The purpose of a Welcome to Country is to Welcome people onto the Country where an event or gathering is taking place. Traditionally this would be an opportunity to teach newcomers of any rules or expectations of the Traditional Owners. A Welcome to Country can be held with an accompanying Smoking Ceremony. A Smoking Ceremony is conducted to clear the air and welcome people to our Country, and also offer healing and connection to Country and land. The Welcome to Country will take place on the pool deck of the Sofitel Hotel Darling Harbour.

Participants may consider, technology pathways for relevant industries, frontier and emerging solutions, and the role of innovation ecosystems in accelerating deployment, among others. This area of discussion may also consider the institutional, financial, and governance frameworks that can support the movement of technologies from demonstration to commercial scale, while highlighting how solutions and approaches have been applied in practice and lessons that may be relevant for other circumstances. 11:15 – 12:45	<u>Area of discussion 2</u> Experiences of other cross-cutting issues as mandated in decision 4/CMA.4, paragraph 4 This session will explore cross-cutting issues, synergies, trade-offs, and co-benefits associated with mitigation action, drawing on national and regional experience. Participants may consider the interactions between mitigation options across different sectors and systems, including interactions with other environmental and socio-economic objectives. They may also discuss how these intersect with broader sustainable development priorities and poverty eradication, and how coordinated approaches could help deliver multiple co-benefits, including equity considerations, participation of diverse stakeholders, international cooperation, while minimizing trade-offs and supporting the reduction of emissions. <u>Breakout Sessions</u>		
The breakout sessions will build upon the themes and issues highlighted during the scene-setting presentations and panel discussions on best practices and actionable solutions in addressing challenges and barriers, including the enablers of ambition and implementation of mitigation action in industries, drawing on national and regional experience and on cross-cutting issues. Participants will engage in sharing best practices and actionable solutions and challenges and barriers with a view to exploring key aspects and enablers for mitigation action in industries drawing on national and regional experience and on cross-cutting issues. The breakout sessions will be organized in two consecutive rounds, with two groups convening in parallel during each round. Each of the two breakout groups will focus on a distinct thematic area, drawn from the preceding scene-setting presentations and panel discussions. Participants will stay in the same room through the breakout sessions. After the first breakout discussion, facilitators will rotate to the other room. This approach will allow all participants to participate in both breakout discussions and contribute to both themes. Each round of discussion will run for approximately 90 minutes with a short break in between to allow facilitators to switch between breakout rooms. Facilitators will keep time and inform about the program. During the breakout discussion participants will have an opportunity for interactive engagement. <u>Theme 1: Experiences of best practices and actionable solutions in addressing challenges and barriers, including the enablers of ambition and implementation of mitigation action in industries</u> Guiding questions: <i>What are the best practices and actionable solutions from your country or region to advance innovation and the development, deployment and scale-up of solutions for decarbonizing industries?</i> <i>What are the key enablers of mitigation action in industries in your country or region and how have they helped address challenges and barriers such as financial, technological, and governance-related barriers, among others?</i> <u>Theme 2: Experiences of other cross-cutting issues as mandated in decision 4/CMA.4, paragraph 4</u> Guiding questions: <i>Drawing on national and regional experiences, what cross-cutting approaches have effectively managed interactions between mitigation options across sectors, and with broader environmental and/or socio-economic goals?</i> <i>What practices, including stakeholder engagement, international cooperation, among others, have delivered co-benefits such as equity, sustainable development, poverty eradication, among others, while managing trade-offs? What enabling conditions supported this?</i>

Panelists will share perspectives on different financing modalities and discuss what it takes to effectively mobilize resources, including the role of blended finance, de-risking instruments and project preparation support. The panel will also examine how to improve institutional readiness and navigate specific funding and technical assistance processes, to enable financing mitigation action in industries.

15:10 – 16:45	Session: investment readiness, project development and investor perspectives This session will bring together investors, financial institutions, climate funds, development banks and project preparation experts to discuss what makes mitigation projects investment-ready and how project proponents can better navigate the path from concept to bankable proposal. The discussion will consider eligibility and assessment criteria, minimum information requirements, common weaknesses in project proposals and practical ways to strengthen project preparation, including through technical assistance, blended finance, de-risking instruments and partnerships. The session will also explore broader enabling conditions that affect access to finance for industrial decarbonization, including creditworthiness, cost of capital, risk perception, regulatory predictability and the role of stable policy and institutional frameworks in reducing risks and mobilizing investment.
