Draft conclusions proposed by the Chairs

- 1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) continued consideration of the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security.¹
- 2. The SBSTA and the SBI recognized that progress was made at these sessions in considering the report on the first in-session workshop as part of the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work,² on the topic of systemic and holistic approaches to implementing climate action on agriculture, food systems³ and food security, understanding, cooperation and integration into plans,⁴ and noted that more time is needed to conclude the discussions thereon.
- 3. The SBSTA and the SBI reiterated the importance of cooperating on the implementation of climate action to address issues related to agriculture and food security in accordance with the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work.
- 4. The SBSTA and the SBI agreed to continue consideration of this matter at their sixty-fourth sessions (June 2026) taking into account the draft text prepared for these agenda items at these sessions.⁵
