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II. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

1. SBI 65 will be opened by the SBI Chair, Julia Gardiner (Australia), on 9 November 2026.

2. Organizational matters

(a) Adoption of the agenda

2. *Background:* In accordance with rules 9–10 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the secretariat, in agreement with the SBI Chair, drafted the provisional agenda for SBI 65.

3. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to adopt its agenda.

(b) Election of officers other than the Chair

4. *Background:* The SBI shall elect its Vice-Chair for 2027. The current Vice-Chair, Eyad Aljubran (Saudi Arabia), will remain in office until his successor is elected. The chairs and coordinators of the regional groups and constituencies have been informed that the deadline for the submission of nominations is 14 November 2026. Parties are invited to recall, inter alia, decisions [23/CP.18](#), [3/CP.23](#) and [7/CP.29](#) and actively consider nominating women.

5. When the SBI exercises its functions with regard to matters concerning the Kyoto Protocol, any member of its Bureau representing a State that is a Party to the Convention but at that time not a Party to the Kyoto Protocol shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from among the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol. This applies mutatis mutandis to the SBI exercising its functions with regard to matters concerning the Paris Agreement.

6. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to elect its Vice-Chair for 2027.

(c) Organization of the work of the session

7. SBI 65 will be held in parallel with SBSTA 65. Information on the organization of the work of the session can be found in the annotations to the provisional agenda for COP 31³ and will be made available on the session web page.⁴ The Chairs of the subsidiary bodies will issue under their own responsibility a joint note in advance of SB 65 on a proposed approach to the work during the sessions.

(d) Facilitative sharing of views

8. The twenty-first facilitative sharing of views under the SBI,⁵ in the form of a workshop open to all Parties, will be convened at SBI 65 for Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention that submitted a BUR and for which a summary report will be finalized by 4 September 2026. Parties may submit written questions in advance.

9. The records of the facilitative sharing of views for the participating Parties will be made available on the UNFCCC website.

(e) Facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress

10. The FMCP is undertaken with respect to a Party's efforts under Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and implementation and achievement of its nationally determined contribution,⁶ and builds on the experience gained under the Convention through the multilateral

(f) Mandated events⁷

12. The following events are mandated to take place in conjunction with SBI or SB 65:

(a) Workshop on the provision of financial and technical support to developing country Parties for reporting and capacity-building pursuant to Article 13 of the Paris Agreement;

(b) Dialogue on how cooperative approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement support ambition;

(c) Dialogue to facilitate the identification of recurring themes and lessons learned, for consideration by Parties, of the compilation and synthesis of the results of the technical expert reviews under Article 6 of the Paris Agreement including in the context of the review of the guidance on cooperative approaches;

(d) Events relating to activities under the workplan of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures and its Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures for 2026–2030:⁸

(i) Technical event pertaining to activity 5: assessing and analysing the impacts, including socioeconomic impacts, of response measures to be implemented in order to achieve all outcomes of the global stocktake and different net zero scenarios and pathways;

(ii) Workshop pertaining to activity 8: facilitating the exchange and sharing of experience and best practices among Parties, the secretariat and other international organizations on conducting impact assessments;

(iii) Technical event pertaining to activity 12: developing case studies to identify the social and economic impacts of economy-wide nationally determined contributions, covering all greenhouse gases, sectors and categories;

(iv) Workshop pertaining to activity 15: enhancing the capacity of Parties to carry out their own assessment and analysis of and produce reports on the impacts of the implementation of response measures through training and capacity-building efforts, including existing initiatives.

3. Reporting from and review of Parties included in Annex I to the Convention

(a) Compilations and syntheses of biennial reports

14. *Background:* The secretariat prepares compilation and synthesis reports on the information reported by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention in their biennial reports.¹⁰ SBI 59 to 62 considered the compilation and synthesis of fifth biennial reports.¹¹

SBI 62 agreed to include this matter in the provisional agenda for SBI 63 on the understanding that the sub-item would be held in abeyance.¹² SBI 63 and 64 agreed to hold this sub-item in abeyance.¹³

(b) Reports on national greenhouse gas inventory data

16. *Background:* The secretariat prepares an annual report containing the latest information on greenhouse gas inventory data submitted by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention for consideration by the COP and its subsidiary bodies.¹⁴ SBI 63 and 64 agreed to defer consideration of the 2025 report to the respective subsequent session.¹⁵

17. The 2026 report prepared for this session covers 1990–2024.

18. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the 2025 and 2026 reports.

4. Reporting from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention

(a) Information contained in national communications

19. *Background:* SBI 62 considered the information contained in NCs from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention and agreed to include this matter in the provisional agenda for SBI 63 on the understanding that the sub-item would be held in abeyance.¹⁶ SBI 63 and 64 agreed to hold this sub-item in abeyance.¹⁷

20. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

(b) Provision of financial and technical support

21. *Background:* Financial and technical support provided to developing country Parties for implementing the measurement, reporting and verification arrangements under the Convention includes funding from the Global Environment Facility, which regularly reports on its activities relating to the preparation of NCs and BURs, and from the CBIT–GSP, and technical support provided by the secretariat.

22. SBI 63 agreed that SBI 64 would continue consideration of this matter, including the frequency of including the matter in the agenda for future sessions of the SBI.¹⁸

23. Since SBI 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter,¹⁹ in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied²⁰ the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

24. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter and take any action it deems appropriate.

(c) Summary reports on the technical analysis of biennial update reports

25. *Background:* Thirty-three rounds of technical analysis covering 180 BURs had been conducted as at 4 September 2026.

26. SBI 64 took note of the summary reports on the technical analysis of BURs finalized by 3 April 2026 and published on the UNFCCC website.²¹ Planning for future rounds of technical analysis is subject to availability of supplementary resources. Any additional summary reports on the technical analysis of BURs conducted between 4 April 2026 and 4 September 2026 will be published on the UNFCCC website.

27. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of any additional published summary reports on the technical analysis of BURs.

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(d) Report of the Consultative Group of Experts

28. *Background:* COP 19 requested the CGE to submit a progress report annually on its work to the SBI for consideration at sessions of the SBI held in conjunction with sessions of the COP,²² and SBI 59 invited the CGE to deliver an oral report on its annual report to the SBI, under the relevant agenda sub-item, starting at SBI 61.²³

29. SBI 63 requested the CGE, in developing and implementing its workplan for 2026, to consider continuing to prepare updates of the technical paper on problems, constraints, lessons learned and capacity-building needs in preparing NCs, BURs and biennial transparency reports.²⁴

30. As per the revised terms of reference of the CGE, adopted at COP 30,²⁵ the CGE shall develop a work programme every four years, starting at its first meeting in 2026, and include information on its progress in implementing the work programme in its annual report prepared for consideration by the SBI.²⁶

31. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the report by the CGE on its work in 2026 and its oral report to be given at the first informal consultation for this item at this session and provide guidance to the CGE, as appropriate. The SBI will also be invited to take any further action it deems appropriate.

5. Reporting and review pursuant to Article 13 of the Paris Agreement: provision of financial and technical support to developing country Parties for reporting and capacity-building

32. *Background:* CMA 7 requested the secretariat to develop and implement a list of activities on an annual basis in 2026–2028, including organizing a workshop in world café format, to be held at the second regular session of the SBI of the year, for considering the outcomes of the activities with a view to informing the next annual cycle of activities.²⁷

33. CMA 7 also requested SBI 65 to consider the submissions and reports from the list of activities referred to in paragraph 32 above with a view to providing guidance to the secretariat, as applicable, on ways of maximizing the reach and effectiveness of the activities to be undertaken in the subsequent annual cycle.²⁸

34. Since SBI 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter,²⁹ in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

35. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter and take any action it deems appropriate taking into account the activities referred to in paragraphs 32–33 above.

6. Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme*

36. *Background:* CMA 7 recalled paragraph 5 of decision [4/CMA.4](#), in which it was decided that implementation of the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme will continue until CMA 8 with a view to adopting a decision on the continuation of the work programme at that session, and invited Parties, observers and other stakeholders to submit views on opportunities, best practices, actionable solutions, challenges and barriers relevant to the continuation, functioning and effectiveness of the work programme with a view to an exchange of views taking place at SB 64.³⁰

37. SB 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the matter.³¹

38. The seventh global dialogue and investment-focused event took place from 21 to 23 April 2026 in Yeosu, Republic of Korea, and the eighth global dialogue and investment-focused event will be held in Sydney, Australia, from 28 to 30 September 2026. The secretariat will prepare an annual report comprising a compilation of the reports on the seventh and eighth dialogues and investment-focused events for consideration at SB 65 and CMA 8.³²

39. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter and consider progress in implementing the work programme, including key findings, opportunities and barriers in this regard, taking into account the annual report referred to in paragraph 38 above, with a view to recommending a draft decision on the matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.

7. United Arab Emirates just transition work programme*

40. *Background:* The fifth dialogue under the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme took place from 24 to 25 April 2026 in Yeosu and the sixth will be held in Baku, Azerbaijan, from 10 to 11 September 2026. The Chairs of the subsidiary bodies, with the assistance of the secretariat, will have prepared informal summaries of the discussions held and an annual summary report on the fifth and sixth dialogues.³³

41. CMA 7 decided to develop a just transition mechanism and requested SB 64 to recommend a draft decision on the process for its operationalization for consideration at CMA 8 and invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views on this process.³⁴

42. SB 64 initiated discussions on the process for the operationalization of the mechanism and agreed that consideration of this matter would continue at SB 65, taking note of the informal note³⁵ prepared by the co-chairs for the relevant agenda items at those sessions as input, recognizing that the informal note was prepared by the co-chairs under their own responsibility and that it does not reflect all views shared and proposals made by Parties, does not represent a basis for further negotiations, is non-exhaustive, includes divergent views,

does not prejudice further work or prevent Parties from expressing additional views at any time, as well as the views submitted no later than four weeks prior to SB 65, with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration at CMA 8.³⁶

43. CMA 7 recalled paragraph 3 of decision [3/CMA.5](#), in which it was agreed to review the effectiveness and efficiency of the work programme and consider its continuation at CMA 8, and requested SB 64 to develop terms of reference for the review and to consider, inter alia, ways to improve existing modalities in developing the terms of reference, without prejudice to the outcome of the consideration of the continuation of the work programme.³⁷

44. SB 64 developed the terms of reference for the review of the work programme and agreed that SB 65 will conduct the review in accordance with the terms of reference with a view to informing the consideration of the continuation of the work programme at CMA 8; invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views on the review of the work programme on the basis of the terms of reference; and requested the secretariat to prepare a report on the views, including proposals for improving the modalities of the work programme.³⁸

45. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of these matters with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.

8. Matters relating to the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures serving the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement*

46. *Background:* The third global dialogue on the impacts of the implementation of response measures will be held in Bangkok, Thailand, from 21 to 22 September 2026, with the 15th meeting of the KCI to take place in Bangkok from 23 to 25 September 2026, after which the secretariat will prepare a summary report capturing the discussions at the dialogue.³⁹

47. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 decided that the forum, at the second regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, will identify the activities that it will undertake on the basis of the workplan at each session of the subsidiary bodies in the subsequent year, and requested the forum and its KCI to implement the workplan for 2026–2030 and make

recommendations to the governing bodies consistent with the functions of the forum and its KCI.⁴⁰

48. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 decided that the forum will conduct the activities referred to in paragraphs 10 and 11 of decisions [6/CP.30](#), [2/CMP.20](#) and [14/CMA.7](#) at SB 64 and 65 respectively.⁴¹

49. SB 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the matter.⁴²

50. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested the KCI to present, at the second regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, its annual report and key findings therefrom to the forum for consideration with a view to the forum making recommendations for consideration by the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁴³

51. The forum will be invited to make recommendations for consideration at COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8, including through consideration of the annual report of the KCI.⁴⁴

52. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to convene the forum with a view to recommending a draft decision on these matters for consideration and adoption at COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8.

9. Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security*

53. *Background:* COP 27 decided to establish the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security and requested the subsidiary bodies to report on the progress and outcomes of the joint work at COP 31.⁴⁵

54. SB 60 requested the secretariat to prepare the annual synthesis report referred to in paragraph 15(a) of decision [3/CP.27](#) and make it available for consideration at the first regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year.⁴⁶ SB 64 took note of the second such annual synthesis report and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the report.⁴⁷

55. SB 64 also took note of the report on the first in-session workshop as part of the joint work,⁴⁸ held at SB 62, and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the report.⁴⁹

56. SB 64 noted that the report of the second in-session workshop, held at SB 64, as part of the joint work will be prepared for consideration at SB 65.⁵⁰

10. Matters relating to adaptation

(a) Global goal on adaptation*

58. *Background:* CMA 6 launched the Baku Adaptation Road Map with the aim of advancing progress in line with Article 7, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement and supporting the implementation of the elements outlined in paragraph 38 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and requested the subsidiary bodies to develop modalities for work under the Road Map.⁵¹

59. CMA 7 concluded the United Arab Emirates–Belém work programme on indicators for measuring progress achieved towards the targets referred to in paragraphs 9–10 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and adopted the Belém Adaptation Indicators.⁵²

60. CMA 7 decided to establish the Belém–Addis vision on adaptation and agreed that work under the vision will be carried out jointly by the subsidiary bodies.⁵³

61. CMA 7 requested the subsidiary bodies to undertake technical work on improving metadata and methodologies for the Belém Adaptation Indicators, to be considered at CMA 9, including by establishing a technical task force to contribute to that work.⁵⁴

62. CMA 7 decided that the first phase of the Baku Adaptation Road Map, covering 2026–2028, shall focus on initial implementation of activities under the Road Map, consisting of two workshops per year convened by the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies with the support of the secretariat and the preparation of a technical paper by the secretariat, aimed at enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening cooperation and facilitating adaptation planning and implementation in line with different national circumstances and in the context of Article 2, paragraph 1(a), of the Paris Agreement.⁵⁵

63. CMA 7 also decided to undertake a review of the Belém Adaptation Indicators as part of the review of the United Arab Emirates Framework for Global Climate Resilience, after the second global stocktake in 2029, and further decided that the subsidiary bodies will develop and agree in 2026–2027 the terms of reference for the review of the Framework.⁵⁶

64. Since SB 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter,⁵⁷ in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

65. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to determining next steps.

(b) Report of the Adaptation Committee*

66. *Background:* COP 17 requested the AC to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies,⁵⁸ and CMA 1 decided that the AC shall serve the Paris Agreement.⁵⁹

67. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the AC with a view to recommending draft decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

(c) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee*

68. *Background:* COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the AC, mandated to take place at COP 27,⁶⁰ as it relates to the Paris Agreement.⁶¹

69. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.⁶² SB 58 to 62 continued consideration of the review.⁶³ SB 63 agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SB 64,⁶⁴ and SB 64 to defer consideration thereof to SB 65.⁶⁵

70. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

(d) National adaptation plans

71. *Background:* COP 30 requested the LEG to compile from relevant reports, in collaboration with the AC and the SCF, an overview of climate finance flows and financial support provided by developed country Parties to developing country Parties for formulating and implementing NAPs for inclusion in the 2026 report on progress in the process to formulate and implement NAPs to be prepared for consideration at SBI 65.⁶⁶

72. COP 30 also requested SBI 65 to continue consideration of NAPs taking into account the 2026 report on progress in the process to formulate and implement NAPs.^{67, 68}

73. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter taking into account the 2026 report on progress in the process to formulate and implement NAPs.

(e) Guidance relating to adaptation communications

74. *Background:* CMA 1 decided to take stock of, and if necessary revise, in 2025, the guidance relating to adaptation communications contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#) taking into account submissions received from Parties and a synthesis report thereon.⁶⁹ CMA 7 invited SBI 64 to continue consideration of the timing to initiate the actions set out in paragraph 5 of decision [4/CMA.7](#).⁷⁰

75. SBI 64 agreed that SBI 65 will continue consideration of this matter on the basis of an informal note available on the UNFCCC website.^{71, 72}

76. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter on the basis of the informal note referred to in paragraph 75 above with a view to agreeing on draft conclusions or recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 8, as appropriate.

11. Matters relating to the least developed countries

77. *Background:* The LEG is mandated to develop a two-year rolling programme of work for consideration by the SBI at its first regular session of each year and to report on its work to the SBI at each of its sessions.⁷³ SBI 64 welcomed the work programme⁷⁴ of the LEG for 2026–2027.⁷⁵

78. COP 30 requested the LEG to hold a meeting during NAP Expo 2026 to facilitate an exchange of views among relevant organizations and other stakeholders on enhancing the provision of support to the least developed countries for implementing NAPs, and to include a summary of those views in its report to SBI 65.⁷⁶

79. COP 30 also requested SBI 64 to initiate the stocktake of the progress of the work of the LEG and its terms of reference with a focus on the evolving needs of the least developed countries, taking into account the information in the synthesis report referred to in paragraph 18 of decision [15/CP.30](#), and to recommend a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31.⁷⁷

80. SBI 64 initiated its stocktake of the progress of the work of the LEG and its terms of reference and agreed that SBI 65 will continue consideration thereof with a view to recommending draft decisions on the matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.⁷⁸

81. SBI 64 recalled paragraph 12 of decision [8/CP.30](#), in which the LEG was requested to compile from relevant reports, in collaboration with the AC and the SCF, an overview of climate finance flows and financial support provided by developed country Parties to developing country Parties for formulating and implementing NAPs for inclusion in the 2026 report on progress in the process to formulate and implement NAPs to be prepared for consideration at SBI 65.⁷⁹

84. As per the terms of reference of the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change,⁸¹ the report of the Santiago network is to be prepared by its secretariat, included in a joint annual report of the Santiago network and the WIM Executive Committee and submitted to the governing body or bodies through the subsidiary bodies.⁸²

85. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the WIM Executive Committee and the Santiago network with a view to recommending a draft decision or decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption by the appropriate body or bodies at the session(s) in November 2026.

86. *Background:* The TEC and the CTCN prepare and submit a joint annual report to the COP and the CMA on their respective activities and the performance of their respective functions.⁸³

87. The CMA adopted decision [18/CMA.7](#) on the Belém Technology Implementation Programme and requested the TEC and the CTCN to include information on actions taken to implement the Programme, as well as on progress of implementation and the outcomes thereof, in their joint annual report to the COP and the CMA.⁸⁴

88. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the TEC and the CTCN and recommend draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

93. SBI 64 agreed that SBI 65 will continue consideration of this matter on the basis of the draft text⁸⁹ prepared by the co-facilitators for the relevant agenda sub-item at SBI 64.⁹⁰

94. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

98. *Background:* SBI 62 agreed that SBI 63 would continue consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AF Board, the arrangements for the AF to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and the initiation of the fifth review of the AF.⁹⁴ SBI 63 could not conclude consideration thereof and agreed to forward the matters to CMP 20 and CMA 7 for consideration.⁹⁵ CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested SBI 64 to continue consideration of these matters.⁹⁶ SBI 64 agreed that SBI 65 will continue consideration of these matters on the basis of the work and progress achieved at SBI 64 and the draft texts available on the UNFCCC website.^{97, 98}

111. *Background:* CMA 7 requested SBI 64 to consider the sufficiency and stability of funding for the operation and maintenance of the infrastructure under Article 6, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement, technical expert review under Article 6, paragraph 2, and capacity-building activities in respect of Article 6, paragraph 2, with a view to recommending a draft decision on the matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.¹¹²

112. CMA 7 also requested the secretariat to update the technical paper on options for funding the activities related to the infrastructure and technical expert review under Article 6, paragraph 2,¹¹³ to serve as input to the consideration referred to in paragraph 111 above.¹¹⁴

113. To facilitate deliberations on the matters referred to in paragraph 111 above, SBI 64 requested its Chair to prepare an informal document,¹¹⁵ including textual proposals, informed by the relevant views expressed by Parties at that session, as captured in an informal note,¹¹⁶ for consideration at SBI 65 with a view to the SBI recommending a draft decision on the matters for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.¹¹⁷

114. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.
