I. Introduction

1. On 3 June 2025 the secretariat received a request from the Plurinational State of Bolivia on behalf of the Like-minded Developing Countries (LMDCs) to include an item in the provisional agenda for the sixty-second session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA).¹
2. In accordance with rule 12 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, and in agreement with the Chair of the SBSTA, this matter has been included in the supplementary provisional agenda as item 15.
