I. Opening of the session

(Agenda item 1)

1. The sixty-second session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) was held at the World Conference Center Bonn in Bonn, Germany, from 16 to 26 June 2025.

2. The Chair of the SBSTA, Adonia Ayebare (Uganda), opened the session and welcomed all Parties and observers. He also welcomed Carol Franco (Dominican Republic) as Vice-Chair and Zita Kassa Wilks (Gabon) as Rapporteur.

3. The opening included remarks by the UNFCCC Executive Secretary, Simon Stiell.

II. Organizational matters

(Agenda item 2)

Adoption of the agenda

(Agenda sub-item 2(a))

4. At its 1st meeting, on 16 June, after the Chairs of the SBSTA and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) extensively consulted with Parties on the adoption of their respective agendas for the session, the SBSTA considered a note by the Executive Secretary containing the supplementary provisional agenda.¹

5. At the resumed 1st meeting, on 17 June, following additional consultations with Parties on the adoption of the agendas, including consultations facilitated by the Presidency of the twenty-ninth session of the Conference of the Parties, the Chair of the SBI recalled the understanding reached by Parties as set out in paragraph 6 below.

6. The understanding regarding the adoption of the supplementary provisional agendas, including the withdrawal of item 15 of the supplementary provisional agenda for SBSTA 62 and items 20–21 of the supplementary provisional agenda for SBI 62,² was as follows:

(a) With regard to item 20 of the supplementary provisional agenda for SBI 62, a footnote will be added to sub-item 2(a) of the agenda stating that the SBSTA Chair and the SBI Chair will hold substantive consultations on Article 9, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement to consider substantive elements regarding the implementation of Article 9, paragraph 1. Both Chairs will take stock of progress on these consultations at the sixty-second sessions of the subsidiary bodies and report back on the outcomes of the consultations at their sixty-third sessions (November 2025) with a view to determining a way forward, including potentially a stand-alone agenda item on this matter;

(b) With regard to item 21 of the supplementary provisional agenda for SBI 62, a footnote will be added to item 8 of the agendas for SBSTA 62 and SBI 62 with a reference to the relevant paragraphs of the reports on these sessions, stating that related issues will be discussed under relevant agenda items, including the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme;

(c) With regard to item 8 of the agendas for SBSTA 62 and SBI 62, it is the understanding of Parties that discussions will continue to include the issues outlined in decision 3/CMA.5, on the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme.

7. The Chair proposed that the supplementary provisional agenda for this session be amended to add the footnotes to sub-item 2(a) and item 8 referred to in paragraph 6 above, and to not include item 15.

- 8. As proposed by the Chair, the SBSTA adopted the agenda as follows:³
