1. Opening of the session

1. SBSTA 65 will be opened by the SBSTA Chair, Adonia Ayebare (Uganda), on 9 November 2026.

2. Organizational matters

2. *Background:* In accordance with rules 9–10 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the secretariat, in agreement with the SBSTA Chair, drafted the provisional agenda for SBSTA 65.
3. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to adopt its agenda.

(b) Election of officers other than the Chair

4. *Background:* The SBSTA shall elect its Vice-Chair for 2027. The current Vice-Chair, Carol Franco (Dominican Republic), will remain in office until her successor is elected. The chairs and coordinators of the regional groups and constituencies have been informed that the deadline for the submission of nominations is 14 November 2026. Parties are invited to recall, inter alia, decisions [23/CP.18](#), [3/CP.23](#) and [7/CP.29](#) and actively consider nominating women.
5. When the SBSTA exercises its functions with regard to matters concerning the Kyoto Protocol, any member of its Bureau representing a State that is a Party to the Convention but at that time not a Party to the Kyoto Protocol shall be replaced by an additional member to

be elected by and from among the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol. This applies *mutatis mutandis* to the SBSTA exercising its functions with regard to matters concerning the Paris Agreement.

6. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to elect its Vice-Chair for 2027.

(c) Organization of the work of the session

7. SBSTA 65 will be held in parallel with SBI 65. Information on the organization of the work of the session can be found in the annotations to the provisional agenda for COP 31³ and will be made available on the session web page.⁴ The Chairs of the subsidiary bodies will issue under their own responsibility a joint note in advance of SB 65 on a proposed approach to the work during the sessions.

(d) Mandated events⁵

8. The following events are mandated to take place in conjunction with SBSTA or SB 65:

- (a) Earth Information Day 2026;
- (b) 19th Focal Point Forum of the Nairobi work programme on impacts, vulnerability and adaptation to climate change;
- (c) 16th meeting of the Facilitative Working Group of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform;
- (d) Events relating to the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform;
- (e) In-session workshop, including plenary presentations and round-table discussions, in conjunction with the 10th meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches;
- (f) Dialogue to facilitate the identification of recurring themes and lessons learned, for consideration by Parties, of the compilation and synthesis of the results of the technical expert reviews under Article 6 of the Paris Agreement including in the context of the review of the guidance on cooperative approaches;
- (g) Events relating to activities under the workplan of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures and its Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures for 2026–2030:⁶
 - (i) Technical event pertaining to activity 5: assessing and analysing the impacts, including socioeconomic impacts, of response measures to be implemented in order to achieve all outcomes of the global stocktake and different net zero scenarios and pathways;
 - (ii) Workshop pertaining to activity 8: facilitating the exchange and sharing of experience and best practices among Parties, the secretariat and other international organizations on conducting impact assessments;
 - (iii) Technical event pertaining to activity 12: developing case studies to identify the social and economic impacts of economy-wide nationally determined contributions, covering all greenhouse gases, sectors and categories;
 - (iv) Workshop pertaining to activity 15: enhancing the capacity of Parties to carry out their own assessment and analysis of and produce reports on the impacts of the

implementation of response measures through training and capacity-building efforts, including existing initiatives.

9. Detailed information on the mandated events for SB 65 is available on the UNFCCC website.⁷

3. Research and systematic observation

10. *Background:* During the second sessional period of each year, the SBSTA focuses its consideration on systematic observation.⁸

11. SBSTA 45 invited the secretariat of the Global Climate Observing System and the World Meteorological Organization to provide relevant updates at sessions of the SBSTA,⁹ and SBSTA 47 invited the Committee on Earth Observation Satellites and the Coordination Group for Meteorological Satellites to report on progress at sessions of the SBSTA, as appropriate.¹⁰

12. The SBSTA Chair prepared an informal summary report on Earth Information Day 2025.¹¹ Earth Information Day 2026 will take place at this session, its organization informed by submissions¹² received on possible themes for and ways to organize Earth Information Day 2026.¹³

13. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to consider this matter and the updates referred to in paragraph 11 above with a view to determining further action, as appropriate.

4. Matters relating to adaptation

(a) Global goal on adaptation*

14. *Background:* CMA 6 launched the Baku Adaptation Road Map with the aim of advancing progress in line with Article 7, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement and supporting the implementation of the elements outlined in paragraph 38 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and requested the subsidiary bodies to develop modalities for work under the Road Map.¹⁴

15. CMA 7 concluded the United Arab Emirates–Belém work programme on indicators for measuring progress achieved towards the targets referred to in paragraphs 9–10 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and adopted the Belém Adaptation Indicators.¹⁵

16. CMA 7 decided to establish the Belém–Addis vision on adaptation and agreed that work under the vision will be carried out jointly by the subsidiary bodies.¹⁶

17. CMA 7 requested the subsidiary bodies to undertake technical work on improving metadata and methodologies for the Belém Adaptation Indicators, to be considered at CMA 9, including by establishing a technical task force to contribute to that work.¹⁷

18. CMA 7 decided that the first phase of the Baku Adaptation Road Map, covering 2026–2028, shall focus on initial implementation of activities under the Road Map, consisting of two workshops per year convened by the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies with the support of the secretariat and the preparation of a technical paper by the secretariat, aimed at enhancing

adaptive capacity, strengthening cooperation and facilitating adaptation planning and implementation in line with different national circumstances and in the context of Article 2, paragraph 1(a), of the Paris Agreement.¹⁸

19. CMA 7 also decided to undertake a review of the Belém Adaptation Indicators as part of the review of the United Arab Emirates Framework for Global Climate Resilience, after the second global stocktake in 2029, and further decided that the subsidiary bodies will develop and agree in 2026–2027 the terms of reference for the review of the Framework.¹⁹

20. Since SB 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter,²⁰ in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied²¹ the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

21. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to determining next steps.

(b) Report of the Adaptation Committee*

22. *Background:* COP 17 requested the AC to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies,²² and CMA 1 decided that the AC shall serve the Paris Agreement.²³

23. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the AC with a view to recommending draft decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

(c) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee*

24. *Background:* COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the AC, mandated to take place at COP 27,²⁴ as it relates to the Paris Agreement.²⁵

25. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.²⁶ SB 58 to 62 continued consideration of the review.²⁷ SB 63 agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SB 64,²⁸ and SB 64 to defer consideration thereof to SB 65.²⁹

26. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

5. Joint annual report of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts and the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change*

27. *Background:* The WIM Executive Committee reports annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies and makes recommendations, as appropriate.³⁰

28. As per the terms of reference of the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change,³¹ the report of the Santiago network is to be prepared by its secretariat, included in a joint annual report of the Santiago network and the WIM Executive Committee and submitted to the governing body or bodies through the subsidiary bodies.³²

29. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the WIM Executive Committee and the Santiago network with a view to recommending a draft decision or decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption by the appropriate body or bodies at the session(s) in November 2026.

6. Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme*

30. *Background:* CMA 7 recalled paragraph 5 of decision [4/CMA.4](#), in which it was decided that implementation of the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme will continue until CMA 8 with a view to adopting a decision on the continuation of the work programme at that session, and invited Parties, observers and other stakeholders to submit views on opportunities, best practices, actionable solutions, challenges and barriers relevant to the continuation, functioning and effectiveness of the work programme with a view to an exchange of views taking place at SB 64.³³

31. SB 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the matter.³⁴

32. The seventh global dialogue and investment-focused event took place from 21 to 23 April 2026 in Yeosu, Republic of Korea, and the eighth global dialogue and investment-focused event will be held in Sydney, Australia, from 28 to 30 September 2026. The secretariat will prepare an annual report comprising a compilation of the reports on the seventh and eighth dialogues and investment-focused events for consideration at SB 65 and CMA 8.³⁵

33. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter and consider progress in implementing the work programme, including key findings, opportunities and barriers in this regard, taking into account the annual report referred to in

7. United Arab Emirates just transition work programme*

34. *Background:* The fifth dialogue under the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme took place from 24 to 25 April 2026 in Yeosu and the sixth will be held in Baku, Azerbaijan, from 10 to 11 September 2026. The Chairs of the subsidiary bodies, with the assistance of the secretariat, will have prepared informal summaries of the discussions held and an annual summary report on the fifth and sixth dialogues.³⁶

35. CMA 7 decided to develop a just transition mechanism and requested SB 64 to recommend a draft decision on the process for its operationalization for consideration at CMA 8 and invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views on this process.³⁷

36. SB 64 initiated discussions on the process for the operationalization of the mechanism and agreed that consideration of this matter would continue at SB 65, taking note of the informal note³⁸ prepared by the co-chairs for the relevant agenda items at those sessions as input, recognizing that the informal note was prepared by the co-chairs under their own responsibility and that it does not reflect all views shared and proposals made by Parties, does not represent a basis for further negotiations, is non-exhaustive, includes divergent views, does not prejudge further work or prevent Parties from expressing additional views at any time, as well as the views submitted no later than four weeks prior to SB 65, with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration at CMA 8.³⁹

37. CMA 7 recalled paragraph 3 of decision [3/CMA.5](#), in which it was agreed to review the effectiveness and efficiency of the work programme and consider its continuation at CMA 8, and requested SB 64 to develop terms of reference for the review and to consider, inter alia, ways to improve existing modalities in developing the terms of reference, without prejudice to the outcome of the consideration of the continuation of the work programme.⁴⁰

38. SB 64 developed the terms of reference for the review of the work programme and agreed that SB 65 will conduct the review in accordance with the terms of reference with a view to informing the consideration of the continuation of the work programme at CMA 8; invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views on the review of the work programme on the basis of the terms of reference; and requested the secretariat to prepare a report on the views, including proposals for improving the modalities of the work programme.⁴¹

39. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to continue consideration of these matters with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.

8. Matters relating to the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures serving the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement*

40. *Background:* The third global dialogue on the impacts of the implementation of response measures will be held in Bangkok, Thailand, from 21 to 22 September 2026, with the 15th meeting of the KCI to take place in Bangkok from 23 to 25 September 2026, after which the secretariat will prepare a summary report capturing the discussions at the dialogue.⁴²

41. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 decided that the forum, at the second regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, will identify the activities that it will undertake on the basis of the workplan at each session of the subsidiary bodies in the subsequent year, and requested the forum and its KCI to implement the workplan for 2026–2030 and make recommendations to the governing bodies consistent with the functions of the forum and its KCI.⁴³

42. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 decided that the forum will conduct the activities referred to in paragraphs 10 and 11 of decisions [6/CP.30](#), [2/CMP.20](#) and [14/CMA.7](#) at SB 64 and 65 respectively.⁴⁴

43. SB 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the matter.⁴⁵

44. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested the KCI to present, at the second regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, its annual report and key findings therefrom to the forum for consideration with a view to the forum making recommendations for consideration by the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁴⁶

45. The forum will be invited to make recommendations for consideration at COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8, including through consideration of the annual report of the KCI.⁴⁷

46. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to convene the forum with a view to recommending a draft decision on these matters for consideration and adoption at COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8.

9. Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security*

47. *Background:* COP 27 decided to establish the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security and requested the subsidiary bodies to report on the progress and outcomes of the joint work at COP 31.⁴⁸

48. SB 60 requested the secretariat to prepare the annual synthesis report referred to in paragraph 15(a) of decision [3/CP.27](#) and make it available for consideration at the first regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year.⁴⁹ SB 64 took note of the second such annual synthesis report and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the report.⁵⁰

49. SB 64 also took note of the report on the first in-session workshop as part of the joint work,⁵¹ held at SB 62, and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the report.⁵²

50. SB 64 noted that the report of the second in-session workshop, held at SB 64, as part of the joint work will be prepared for consideration at SB 65.⁵³

51. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to determining next steps.

10. Matters relating to technology development and transfer: joint annual report of the Technology Executive Committee and the Climate Technology Centre and Network*

52. *Background:* The TEC and the CTCN prepare and submit a joint annual report to the COP and the CMA on their respective activities and the performance of their respective functions.⁵⁴

53. The CMA adopted decision [18/CMA.7](#) on the Belém Technology Implementation Programme and requested the TEC and the CTCN to include information on actions taken to implement the Programme, as well as on progress of implementation and the outcomes thereof, in their joint annual report to the COP and the CMA.⁵⁵

54. *Action:* The SBSTA and the SBI will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the TEC and the CTCN and recommend draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

11. Matters relating to Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement

(a) Meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches

55. *Background:* The GCNMA is convened by the SBSTA Chair and meets in conjunction with the first and second regular sessions of the SBSTA each year.⁵⁶ GCNMA 10 will take place in conjunction with this session.

56. CMA 7 invited Parties to consider national processes for identifying and selecting NMAs under the identified focus areas of the work programme activities under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision [4/CMA.3](#), as appropriate; also invited Parties and their national focal points for Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement, as appropriate, to share their experience, best practices, lessons learned and case studies pertaining to NMAs with a view to improving implementation thereof, including by making use of the NMA Platform's online discussion forum⁵⁷ and the in-session workshops and spin-off groups held in conjunction with the meetings of the GCNMA; and further invited Parties to record their NMAs on the NMA Platform to facilitate information exchange and stakeholder engagement and to make use of the discussion forum for collaborating on potential NMAs.⁵⁸

57. SBSTA 64 took note of the invitation from CMA 7⁵⁹ for Parties and observers to submit views and information on topics for discussion at the in-session workshop to be held in conjunction with GCNMA 10.⁶⁰

58. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to convene GCNMA 10 with a view to continuing to implement the work programme activities and determine further action, as appropriate.

(b) Review of the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3

59. CMA 3 requested SBSTA 64 and 65 to review the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision [4/CMA.3](#), including its activities, with a view to enhancing the effectiveness of the work programme, taking into account relevant inputs, including the outcomes of the global stocktake, and to make recommendations thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.⁶¹

60. CMA 7 also requested the SBSTA to conduct its review of the work programme taking into account the annual progress reports of the GCNMA; statistics on the use of the NMA Platform, including in relation to unique visitors and user activity on the online discussion forum; the experience of national focal points for Article 6, paragraph 8, with the NMA Platform and their relevant views; and views of stakeholders on how to increase the effectiveness of the work programme activities.⁶²

61. CMA 7 further requested SBSTA 64, in the context of the work programme, to consider ways to implement additional functionalities in the NMA Platform that would enable Parties to record the projects that they identify under the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme through their national focal points for Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement, and enable interconnection between the NMA Platform and other platforms, including national platforms for Parties that request it, with a view to the SBSTA recommending a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.⁶³

62. CMA 7 requested the secretariat to prepare a technical paper exploring options for the operationalization of additional features and functionalities of the NMA Platform for consideration at SBSTA 64.⁶⁴

63. SBSTA 64 initiated the review of the work programme; took note of the report by the secretariat on inputs to the review of the work programme,⁶⁵ the technical paper referred to in paragraph 62 above, related presentations delivered by the secretariat at that session and the informal note⁶⁶ prepared by the co-facilitators for the relevant agenda item at that session, which captures views expressed by Parties at the session; requested the SBSTA Chair to prepare an informal document,⁶⁷ informed by the relevant views expressed by Parties at that session, for consideration at SBSTA 65; and agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBSTA 65.⁶⁸

64. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.

12. Methodological issues

(a) Greenhouse gas data interface

65. *Background:* SBSTA 62 requested the secretariat to further develop the greenhouse gas data interface using the infrastructure of the climate data hub, incorporating data and information reported by Parties under the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, with separate data entry labels on the interface, and to develop and publish the modules outlined in the presentation made at SBSTA 62.⁶⁹ The SBSTA decided to consider additional modules at SBSTA 64.⁷⁰

66. Since SBSTA 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter,⁷¹ in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

67. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to determining next steps.

13. Annual report on technical reviews: technical review of greenhouse gas inventories of Parties included in Annex I to the Convention

70. *Background:* The secretariat prepares an annual report containing the latest information on the technical review of greenhouse gas inventories submitted by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention, including information on how to improve the quality, efficiency and consistency of the review.⁷³

71. The technical review of the greenhouse gas inventory reports submitted by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention in 2026 will take place as part of the technical review of the second biennial transparency reports and be conducted in accordance with the corresponding modalities, procedures and guidelines contained in chapter VII of the annex to decision [18/CMA.1](#).

72. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to note the information referred to in paragraph 71 above.

14. Cooperation with other international organizations

73. *Background:* SBSTA 30 requested the secretariat to prepare, before sessions at which this agenda item is taken up, an information paper summarizing relevant cooperative activities, to enable Parties to comment on the information, as appropriate.⁷⁴

74. SBSTA 63 agreed to forward the matter to COP 30 for further consideration.⁷⁵ COP 30 invited Parties and observers to submit views on enhancing the inclusiveness of cooperation with other international organizations as well as on the cooperation with the other Rio Convention secretariats and agreed that SBSTA 64 would consider the matter further taking into consideration those submissions.⁷⁶

75. Since SBSTA 64 could not conclude consideration of this matter,⁷⁷ in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

76. *Action:* The SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to determining next steps.
