I. General information

A. Welcome

Welcome to the eighteenth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 18) and the eighth session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP 8).

The conference will be hosted by the Government of Qatar and will take place at the the Qatar National Convention Centre (QNCC) from 26 November to 7 December 2012. In this brochure you will find information and contact details for all official Side Events and Exhibits to be held during the conference.

Access: Presenters and other participants of Side Events and/or Exhibits must be registered through a Party or an observer organization and in possession of a conference badge in order to access the conference venue.

Locations: Side Events are mostly held in Hall 5 of the QNCC, whilst Exhibits are all located in Hall 4 of the QNCC.

Meeting schedule: For details on individual meetings, venues and other activities please consult the [UNFCCC website](#), the Daily Programme, the CCTV monitors or the notice boards located throughout the conference venue. Last-minute changes can be shown only on the CCTV monitors.

The version on the PaperSmart portal will provide additional features, such as allowing readers to filter information by different criteria.

A schedule of all daily meetings of ‘Groups other than the Convention and Protocol bodies’ and ‘Meetings of observer organizations’ will be announced in the Daily Programme on the first day of the sessions. From the second day onwards, these sections will only announce any additional meetings or when there are changes to the original meetings. All meetings will be announced via the CCTV monitors daily.

Launched in COP17/CMP 7 in Durban last year, Momentum for Change provides a public platform to showcase broad-ranging climate change actions that are already achieving tangible results on the ground. By shining light on inspiring and transformational mitigation and adaptation activities, Momentum for Change aims to strengthen motivation, spur innovation and catalyse further change towards a low-carbon, high resilient future.

This year's activities fall under the Urban Poor pillar of Momentum for Change, which has been generously funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. They consist of mitigation and adaptation activities that are a result of collaborative efforts between the public and private sectors and benefit the urban poor in developing countries. This year's nine Lighthouse Activities range from an initiative led by women in Uganda to mitigate climate change while promoting economic development opportunities, to a project in Peru that promotes energy efficiency in an artisanal brick factory, to game-changing bus rapid transit systems in India and China.

A special event on the 4 December will celebrate the 2012 Lighthouse Activities in the presence of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and other dignitaries. There will be an ability to learn more about the 2012 Lighthouse Activities during their presentation on 5 of December.

Two new pillars will also be launched in Doha. In collaboration with the Rockefeller Foundation, Momentum for Change: Women for Results, will be launched on the evening of 5 December. This pillar will provide recognition to the important role played by women in mitigation and adaptation to climate change.

In collaboration with the World Economic Forum, the United Nations Climate Change secretariat will launch Momentum for Change: Innovative Finance on 6 December 2012. This pillar will showcase innovative and proven financing examples to support adaptation and mitigation activities in developing countries.

II. Side Events

The upload facility is also available to all Exhibit organizers for uploading electronic publications to the UNFCCC website. The facility can be accessed by Side Event and Exhibit organizers through the [Side Events and Exhibits Online Registration System](#) (SEORS). For advertising your event, you can go beyond the limited character spaces for the title and the theme within SEORS by uploading detailed agenda and expanded description of your event using this function. Changes can be made by replacing or deleting the existing files up to four weeks after the conference. Please note that individual files should not exceed 4 MB, but it is possible to upload as many files as needed.

Since 2011, the side event schedules are not printed in the Daily Programme as part of the on-going efforts to reduce the carbon footprint of the conference. This year, the secretariat further strengthened its sustainability efforts and introduced the UN PaperSmart from COP 18/CMP 8. In this context, the Daily Programme will this year only be available in electronic format through the PaperSmart portal.

B. The United Nations system delivering as one on sustainable solutions for climate action

United Nations system experts cooperate closely in a committed effort to support the international community in addressing climate change within a framework for action adopted by the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination (CEB), under the chairmanship of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon. This framework has targeted priority areas to achieve results on climate change action. Each agency contributes to this joint effort on the basis of its respective area of expertise, intergovernmental mandate and available resources. The overall objective is to maximize existing synergies, eliminate duplication and overlaps, while at the same time optimizing the impact of the collective efforts of the United Nations system in supporting countries in their efforts to combat climate change.

This breadth and coherence of United Nations system activities is reflected in 17 Side Events at COP18/CMP8. Those side events gather a number of agencies under a thematic focus and demonstrate how the United Nations system responds to country needs and supports implementation of climate action at global, regional, national and local levels, given the urgent need to accelerate action on adaptation and mitigation.

The Arab world has a long tradition, history and experience in coping with extreme climatic conditions given its geographic location mostly spread over desert and arid land. In the face of a long history of dealing with water scarcity, droughts, extreme weather, and highly sensitive land and ecosystems, Arabs developed remarkable resilience to climate change and variability. This resilience was built on centuries of accumulated knowledge, experience, and “*hikma*” (wisdom), which if shared with the rest of the world would provide valuable lessons in climate change mitigation and adaptation.

Today, climate change poses new challenges to Arab societies as these groups also face profound social, economic, political and cultural changes. Arab populations can respond to climate change and promote innovation by bridging useful lessons from the past with new scientific and technological developments. Furthermore, the Arab world can unleash civil society’s potential as a fundamental ingredient of climate change efforts, by creating opportunities for its participation in policy development, discussion and implementation.

This accumulated wealth of knowledge, which has enriched the Arab world for centuries, is not well known globally and has had so far a limited presence in the international climate change agenda. COP18/CMP8, organized in Doha, Qatar, provides an unprecedented and unique opportunity for the Arab world to join the international efforts and discussions underway. “*Hikma*” hours are a series of eleven side events that form an immediate action and expression of the blossoming Arab engagement in the global climate change conversation.

All events in the Al Hikma Hours will benefit from Arabic-English simultaneous interpretation, and will take place in Room 9 of the Side Events Hall (Hall 4) of the QNCC.
