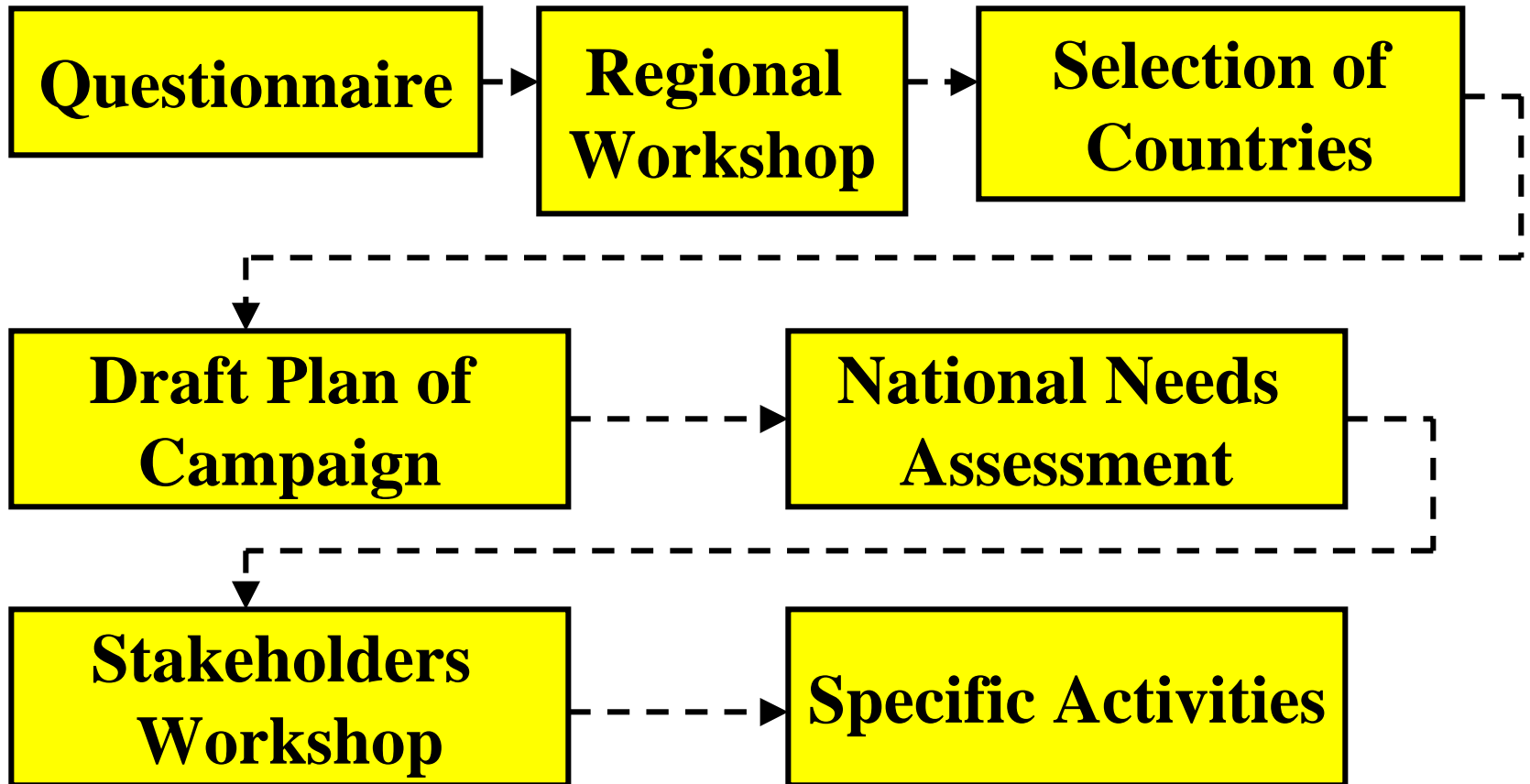

UNEP and national Art. 6 campaigns (methodology)



Questionnaire

- Developed by UNEP
- General awareness of Article 6 in the region
- Ranking of Article 6 issues
- Priorities in Article 6 elements
- Target groups to be approached
- SWOT analysis

Regional Workshop

- Review regional and national activities on Article 6
- Consider opportunities and constraints in launching national Article 6 campaigns
- Refine priorities for national campaigns
- Arrange preliminary consultations with countries

Selection of Countries (criteria)

- Initial experience with Article 6 in NC
- Clear interest in promoting Article 6 activities
- Notion of national climate outreach priorities
- Minimum human and financial resources to launch a national campaign
- Experience in working with donor agencies

Draft Plan of Campaign

- In dialogue with national UNFCCC focal point and concerned stakeholders
- Time frame and overall budget
- National priorities to be addressed
- National institutions to be involved
- Division of responsibilities between UNEP and the country
- Draft MOU between UNEP and the country

National Needs Assessment

- Access general awareness of climate change in the country
- Take stock of current national activities and programmes relevant to Article 6
- Identify existing human resources and other assets
- Identify needs for greater capacity and funds
- Prepare for the dialogue with stakeholders

Stakeholders Workshop

- Review and validate findings of needs assessment
- Agree on priorities in climate change outreach activities
- Make recommendations on implementation mechanisms and resource allocation
- Produce a strategy paper on sustainable and long-term Article 6 programme

Specific Activities

- Proceed from decisions of stakeholders workshop
- Meet immediate and most urgent needs of Article 6 areas
- Simple but with huge demonstration effect
- Cost-effective
- Create a foundation for further actions
