

High Vulnerability to Climate Change




Legal and Institutional Framework

Adaptation to climate change and environmental conservation is in the fourth pillar of the National Development Strategy 2030 Organic Law 01-12.






Institutional Framework National Council for Climate Change and Clean Development Mechanism

Conclusion and Reflections

 For ensuring institutional sustainability, climate change should be mainstreamed at all levels of the education system, using different approaches and strategies for each level.

 For strengthening national capacity, a climate change national education strategy must be based in the country policy framework and serve as both a means and an end for climate change policy implementation.

 For fostering legitimacy and effectiveness of climate change learning priority actions, a multisectoral and multistakeholder consultative process approach should be carried, and learning programs tailored to country context.
