

## TEC 10 outcomes

- TEC requested the Mitigation task force to undertake this year:
  1. Prepare a TEC Brief on distributed generation – turning the background paper into a brief and taking into account:
    - Relevant elements and outcomes of the thematic dialogue
    - Inputs from relevant international/regional organizations
  2. Prepare draft key messages for COP 21, drawing upon the TEC Brief, for the consideration at TEC 11
  3. Initiate preparation of a paper, in collaboration with relevant organizations, to deepen the consideration of some aspects related to distributed RE generation, that is: business models, markets, capacity-building/human capital, and future distributed RE technologies
  
- Preparation of a summary of the outcomes of the thematic dialogue



## Work undertaken since TEC 10

- Summary of the outcomes of the thematic dialogue: made available on TT:CLEAR on 4 May
- Preparation of TEC Brief
  - Preparation of the ToR for a mandate to a consultant to prepare the TEC Brief
    - Consultant: Paul Komor (same as background paper)
  - Zero Draft TEC Brief submitted by consultant on 8 May
    - Comments provided by TF on 15 May
  - First Draft TEC Brief submitted by consultant on 4 June
    - Forwarded to TF and the seven designated organizations: CTCN, IEA, OLADE, CARILEC, PPA, APUA and NREL
      - Comments to be received on 11 June, and compiled and sent to TF on 12 June
    - All comments to be provided to consultant on 15 June

    - Clear, durable, and effective framework, in particular for stimulating private sector involvement/investment
    - Policies need careful design, thoughtful implementation, and continual monitoring, evaluation, and fine-tuning
