1. Opening of the meeting

1. The Chair of the Technology Executive Committee (TEC) will open the 33rd meeting of the TEC (TEC 33) on 15 September 2026 at 9.00 a.m. Central European Summer Time (CEST).

2. **Background:** In accordance with the rules of procedure of the TEC, the TEC shall, at the beginning of each meeting, adopt the meeting agenda. A draft provisional agenda for TEC 33 was prepared by the Chair and Vice-Chair, with the assistance of the secretariat, and was circulated to the TEC members for comments before the meeting.¹
3. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to adopt the agenda for TEC 33.

4. **Background:** TEC 33 will be held from 15 to 17 September 2026, convened daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. CEST. The meeting will be open to attendance by Parties, observer States and admitted observer organizations as observers, unless otherwise decided by the TEC. On 18 September 2026, the TEC and the Advisory Board of the Climate Technology Centre and Network (CTCN AB) will convene a joint session from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Both meetings will be webcast live.
5. A tentative work schedule for the meeting presents the proposed sequence and indicative timeline for the agenda items.
6. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to take note of the proposed organization of work of the meeting.

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3. Update on relevant meetings, events, and initiatives

(a) Outcomes of the Bonn Climate Change Conference June 2026

7. **Background:** At TEC 33, the secretariat will present the key outcomes of the UN Climate Change Conference held in Bonn, Germany in June 2026, highlighting outcomes relevant to the work of the Technology Mechanism, in particular the TEC. The TEC Chair and Vice-Chair will also report on the events organized by the TEC and their participation in relevant meetings and events during the conference.

(b) **Outlook for the Antalya Climate Change Conference November 2026**

9. **Background:** At TEC 33, the secretariat will present an overview of intergovernmental work and processes related to technology development and transfer, including relevant events scheduled to take place at the UN Climate Change Conference in Antalya, Türkiye in November 2026, as they relate to the work of the TEC.

10. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to take note of the information provided.

4. **Implementation of the rolling workplan for 2023–2027**

(a) **National systems of innovation and collaborative research, development and demonstration and general-purpose technologies**

i. National Systems of Innovation

11. **Background:** As per activity A.1.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to continue the work on national systems of innovation (NSI), building upon the TEC's compilation of good practices and lessons learned on the setup and implementation of NSI.
12. In 2026, the TEC, in collaboration with the European Commission Joint Research Centre (JRC), will develop a mapping tool to support the set up and implementation of NSIs and test it in pilot countries.
13. At TEC 33, a co-lead of the open-ended activity group will provide an update on its work.
14. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the update and provide guidance.

ii. Research development and demonstration: Energy storage

15. **Background:** As per activity A.2.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to publish a knowledge product on energy storage in 2027.
16. As requested at TEC 32 the open-ended activity group, in collaboration with the Future Cleantech Architects (FCA) and the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA), developed the draft policy brief "Accelerating the deployment of energy storage to advance clean energy transitions".
17. At TEC 33, a representative of the open-ended activity group, with the support of FCA and IRENA, will report on the progress under the activity and present the draft policy brief.
18. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to provide guidance to the open-ended activity group on the draft policy brief on accelerating the deployment of energy storage to advance clean energy transitions.

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iii. Incubators and accelerators

19. **Background:** As per activity A.2.2 of the rolling workplan, in 2026, the TEC is to prepare a knowledge product on climate technology incubators and accelerators in developing countries, in partnership with the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), including key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA.
20. At TEC 33, a representative of UNIDO will be invited, along with a co-lead of this open-ended activity group, to present the draft knowledge product. Moreover, a co-lead will present proposed key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA, drawn from this work.
21. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to:
- (a) Consider the draft knowledge product and provide guidance for its finalization;

(b) Consider and agree on the key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA for inclusion in the TEC annual report for 2026.

iv. Emerging and transformational adaptation technologies

22. **Background:** As per activity A.3.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to prepare a knowledge product in 2026.
23. As requested at TEC 32, the open-ended activity group revised the draft policy brief on advancing community-based early warning systems, with a focus on people-centred early warning, emphasizing low-technology, accessible, last-mile solutions that are aligned with the Early Warnings for All initiative.² The open-ended activity group also developed draft key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA on advancing community-based early warning systems.
24. At TEC 33, a co-lead of the open-ended activity group, with the support of the International Organization for Migration (IOM), will present the revised draft policy brief and key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA on advancing community-based early warning systems.
25. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to:

- (a) Consider the revised draft policy brief and provide guidance to the open-ended activity group, with a view to finalizing the document after TEC 33;
- (b) Consider and agree on the key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA for inclusion in the TEC annual report for 2026.

v. Digital Technologies: Artificial intelligence

26. **Background:** As per activity A.4.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to explore the role of artificial intelligence (AI) and applied machine learning as enablers of climate solutions.
27. At TEC 33, a co-lead of the open-ended activity group will present:
- (a) The revised draft policy brief on opportunities, risks and challenges of AI for climate action;
- (b) The draft ITU-TEC joint publication on digital technologies and NDCs, with the support of a representative of ITU;
- (c) An update on the work under this activity, with the support of the secretariat.
28. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to provide guidance to the open-ended activity group on the finalization of the revised draft policy brief and the draft ITU-TEC joint publication.

(b) Technology needs assessments and technology planning tools to support NDC implementation: Technology Needs Assessment

29. **Background:** As per activity B.1.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to publish a joint knowledge product on 'How developing countries can be supported in implementing their technology action plans (TAPs) and TNA outcomes' in partnership with the UNEP-Copenhagen Climate Centre (UNEP-CCC).
30. At TEC 33, a representative of UNEP-CCC will be invited, along with a co-lead of this open-ended activity group, to present a draft working paper that will serve as the basis for developing a practical guide on the topic. Moreover, pursuant to an agreement at TEC 32, a co-lead of the open-ended activity group will provide an update on the development of a set of key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA based on the work of the TEC on TNAs under the current rolling workplan (2023–2027).
31. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the:
 - (a) Draft working paper and provide guidance to the open-ended activity group for further work on this matter;
 - (b) Update by the open-ended activity group on the development of the key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA, with a view to determining further follow-up action, as appropriate.

(c) Transformative and innovative solutions

i. Water-energy-food systems;

32. **Background:** As per activity C.1.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to build on its previous work on climate-smart agriculture, analyse gaps on the water-energy-food nexus and identify relevant adaptation technologies, including indigenous, innovative and digital technologies to strengthen adaptation planning and NDC ambitions in the agriculture sector. The TEC, in collaboration with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), agreed to develop, in 2027, a toolkit on enhancing technology development and transfer, addressing barriers such as access to finance, and strengthening evidence-based solutions related to agrifood systems and adaptation.
33. At TEC 33 a co-lead of the open-ended activity group, with the support of FAO, will present the draft toolkit for scaling up climate technology solutions in agrifood systems.
34. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the document and provide guidance.

ii. Buildings and infrastructure

35. **Background:** As per activity C.2.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to explore the use of low carbon materials in buildings, green building codes and green zoning systems that promote energy efficiency and resilience, with a view to support countries in the implementation of their NDCs.
36. As requested at TEC 32, the open-ended activity group with the support of the Global Alliance for Buildings and Construction (GlobalABC) and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Climate Policy Center, revised the draft policy brief "Leveraging Data to Accelerate Financing for Climate Technologies in Buildings and Infrastructure" and prepared key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA drawn from the draft policy brief.

37. At TEC 33, a co-lead of the open-ended activity group, with the support of representatives of the GlobalABC secretariat and the MIT Climate Policy Center will present draft key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA.
38. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider and agree on the key messages and recommendations to the COP and CMA for inclusion in the TEC annual report for 2026.

iii. Transformative industry

39. **Background:** As per activity C.3.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to promote low and near zero emission production and products through the support of innovation, enabling environments, sustainable purchasing commitments, and financing in order to inform NDC planning and implementation.
40. At TEC 33, a co-lead of the open-ended activity group will provide an update on work under this activity.
41. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the update and provide guidance on further work under this activity.

(d) **Collaboration and engagement with other UNFCCC processes and constituted bodies and other UN agencies**

- i. Collaboration and engagement with the Standing Committee on Finance, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism and the Adaptation Fund
42. **Background:** As per activity D.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to collaborate and engage with the Standing Committee on Finance (SCF), the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism and the Adaptation Fund.
43. At TEC 32, the TEC took note of the information regarding the provision of inputs to the draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism in 2026, as communicated by the SCF, and agreed to conduct this work intersessionally (Activity D.1.1). At the same meeting, the TEC also agreed to provide inputs to the Green Climate Fund (GCF) updated strategic plan (Activity D.1.3).
44. At TEC 33:
- (a) The TEC Chair will report updates regarding submissions of inputs by the TEC to the SCF on the draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism³, and to the GCF Secretariat on the GCF's 3rd Updated Strategic Plan for 2028-2031⁴;
- (b) Representatives of the GCF, the Global Environment Facility and the Adaptation Fund will be invited to present latest developments in their work on supporting technology development and transfer.
45. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to take note of the information provided.

ii. Collaboration and engagement with the UNEP-Copenhagen Climate Centre

46. **Background:** As per activity D.6.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to contribute to the UNEP-CCC Climate Technology Progress Report (CTPR) series.
47. At TEC 33, a representative of UNEP-CCC will present an update on the preparation of the CTPR for 2026.
48. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to take note of the information provided.

(e) **Update on other activities of the rolling workplan for 2023–2027**

49. **Background:** During its meetings, the TEC reviews activities and deliverables under its 2023–2027 rolling workplan, which are considered under the respective agenda items.
50. At TEC 33, the secretariat will present any changes of activities, deliverables or partners to the TEC rolling workplan as agreed by the TEC.
51. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the information presented and provide guidance.

5. **Implementation of the Belém Technology Implementation Programme**

52. **Background:** By decision 18/CMA.7, Parties adopted the Belém Technology Implementation Programme (BTIP) and decided that its implementation would commence immediately after CMA 7 (November 2025). At TEC 32, in consideration of relevant mandates arising from the BTIP, the TEC highlighted the importance of, inter alia, conducting mapping exercises and analytical work to inform the development of its next rolling workplan, consulting and collaborating with the CTCN and its Advisory Board, engaging with and carrying out outreach activities aimed at financial institutions and international organizations, and drawing on relevant lessons learned from previous work, processes and reviews, to inform actions to be taken by the TEC in response to the mandates from the BTIP.
53. As per activity D.10.1 of the rolling workplan⁵, at its second meeting in 2026, the TEC is to determine the topic of the global in-session dialogue to be organized under the Belém Technology Implementation Programme in 2027, taking into account the submissions by Parties, and observers and other non-Party stakeholders received through the UNFCCC submission portal⁶, the key messages and recommendations for the CMA contained in the joint annual reports of the TEC and the CTCN, and the challenges identified in the first periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism.
54. The TEC is also requested to, together with the CTCN, with the support of the secretariat and interested partners, in consultation with the Chair of the SBI, and with the participation of a broad range of stakeholders, convene the first global in-session dialogue at SBI 66 (June 2027).
55. At TEC 33, the Chair and Vice-Chair of the TEC, with support from the secretariat, will present:
 - (a) An update on actions taken by the TEC in response to mandates arising from the BTIP, including those pursuant to discussions at TEC 32;
 - (b) An overview of relevant information to be taken into account for determining the topic of the first global dialogue under the BTIP, and facilitate discussions thereon; and
 - (c) The proposed timeline and next steps for the organization of the first global dialogue under the BTIP, including expectations for TEC 34.
56. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the information presented and:
 - (a) Discuss actions to be taken by the TEC for the implementation of the BTIP;

- (b) Determine the topics of the first global dialogue under the BTIP, to be conducted in 2027;

58. At TEC 32, the Chair and the Vice-Chair were requested to prepare a draft strategic road map for the development of the next TEC rolling workplan.
59. The Chair and the Vice-Chair of the TEC will present the draft strategic roadmap for developing the next rolling workplan of the TEC.
60. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the document and provide guidance.

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7. 2026 National Designated Entity survey

61. **Background:** Decision 18/CP.27 provided guidance to the TEC and the CTCN to continue enhancing their efforts to monitor and evaluate the impacts of their work, including by identifying new ways to invite feedback from national designated entities (NDEs) on the impact of the work of the Technology Mechanism, such as through more practical and effective surveys.
62. The TEC, together with the CTCN, conducted the joint biennial NDE survey for 2026 between March and July 2026.
63. At TEC 33, the secretariat will present the findings of the 2026 NDE survey.
64. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to provide guidance to the secretariat based on the results of the NDE survey, as relevant to the work of the TEC.

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8. Gender mainstreaming

65. **Background:** As per activity D.4.1 of the rolling workplan, the TEC is to continually collaborate and engage with the UNFCCC Gender Team on mainstreaming gender in the work of the TEC, with support from the open-ended activity group, including the TEC gender focal points.
66. At TEC 33, the gender focal point, with the support of the secretariat, will report on progress of gender mainstreaming within the work of the TEC and initiate discussion on the next election of gender focal points for 2027-2028.
67. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to take note of the information provided and decide the timeline for the next election of gender focal points.

9. Annual report of the Technology Executive Committee for 2026

68. **Background:** In accordance with COP and CMA decisions, the joint annual report shall include progress of work of the TEC and challenges and lessons learned in implementing mandates from Parties^{7 8 9}, for consideration by the COP and CMA through its subsidiary bodies.
69. Decision 18/CMA.7 requested the TEC and the CTCN to include information on actions taken to implement the Belém Technology Implementation Programme in their joint annual reports.
70. At TEC 33, the Chair and Vice-Chair of the TEC will present the draft annual report of the TEC for 2026 for consideration by the TEC.
71. **Expected action:** The TEC will be invited to consider the draft annual report, including lessons learned and challenges, and authorize the Chair and Vice-Chair of the TEC to finalize the annual report of the TEC for 2026.

74. The TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will meet in a joint session on 18 September 2026 to discuss their joint activities and common areas of work under the Joint Work Programme of the Technology Mechanism for 2023–2027. The following sub-agenda items will be considered at this joint session.

76. **Background:** The UNFCCC secretariat will present an overview of the main outcomes of SB 64 on matters relevant to the work of the Technology Mechanism. This will include, inter alia, updates on the negotiation items under SB 64 relating to the host of the Climate Technology Centre, linkages between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism, the second periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism, and the joint annual report of the Technology Executive Committee and the Climate Technology Centre and Network, as well as engagement of the Technology Mechanism at the session.
77. The secretariat will also provide an update on the expected agenda items for SB 65 and COP31.
78. **Expected action:** The TEC and CTCN Advisory Board will be invited to take note of the information provided.

(b) Implementation of the Joint Work Programme of the Technology Mechanism for 2023–2027**i. Technology Mechanism Initiative on Artificial Intelligence for Climate Action**

79. **Background:** The TEC and the CTCN secretariats will provide an update on progress in implementing the workplan of the Technology Mechanism Initiative on AI for Climate Action (2024–2027), including the AI for Climate Action Award 2026 and the COP 31 Masterclass on AI for Water-Energy-Food Systems.
80. **Expected action:** The TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will be invited to consider the information presented and to provide guidance for further work on these matters.

(c) Implementation of the Belém Technology Implementation Programme

81. **Background:** By decision 18/CMA.7, Parties decided that the implementation of the Belém Technology Implementation Programme (BTIP) shall commence immediately after CMA7.
82. The Chairs of the TEC and the director of the CTCN Secretariat will provide an update on actions taken by the TEC and the CTCN to implement the BTIP since the last joint session, including the participation in an information briefing to Parties convened by the SBI Chair and the COP 30 Presidency on the margins of SB 64.
83. The Chairs of the TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will facilitate a discussion on the **implementation** of the BTIP joint mandates to the Technology Mechanism, including the incorporation of the elements of the Programme into the joint work programme of the Technology Mechanism, preparations for the global dialogue to be conducted in 2027, and joint resource mobilization efforts.
84. **Expected action:** The TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will be invited to take note of the information presented and discuss follow-up actions, as appropriate.

(d) Joint Annual Report of the TEC and CTCN

85. **Background:** The Chairs and Vice-Chairs of the TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will present the draft joint chapter of the joint annual report of the Technology Executive Committee and the Climate Technology Centre and Network for 2026. The draft will include the Technology Mechanism's response to relevant mandates and invitations from the COP and the CMA, in the context of the implementation of the joint work programme.
86. **Expected action:** The TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will be invited to consider the draft joint chapter and provide guidance to their respective Chairs and Vice-Chairs to support its finalization, in line with established reporting requirements and timelines under the UNFCCC process.

87. **Background:** Decision 18/CP.27, paragraph 6, invited the TEC and the CTCN to strengthen their systematic engagement with NDEs, including through NDE regional forums, with a view to increasing the reach and impact of the work of the Technology Mechanism on policies and practices on the ground.
88. The secretariats will provide an update of the outcomes of the joint engagement during the NDE forums held in 2026 for Latin America and the Caribbean, Asia, Eastern Europe and SIDS.
89. Following the presentation, the Secretariats will invite TEC and CTCN Advisory Board members who participated in the regional forums to share their reflections and feedback.

90. **Expected action:** The TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will be invited to take note of the information provided.

ii. Results of the Fourth Technology Mechanism Biennial National Designated Entities survey

91. **Background:** As part of their joint activities under the joint work programme, the TEC and the CTCN jointly developed and disseminated the Fourth Technology Mechanism Biennial National Designated Entities survey between March and July 2026.
92. The secretariats will present an overview of the results relevant to the work of both bodies.
93. **Expected action:** The TEC and the CTCN Advisory Board will be invited to take note of the information provided and discuss any potential follow-up actions, as appropriate.

(f) **Preparation of the next joint work programme of the Technology Mechanism**
