Transport

From Cologne/Bonn airport:

By bus: To get to Bonn by public transport, take the SB 60 bus, which leaves from the airport terminal for Bonn Central Station every 30 minutes on weekdays and every 30 to 60 minutes on weekends. The 25 km bus journey from the airport takes about 30 minutes. The bus stop for Bonn is located at Terminal 1. Detailed information can be found here: [By train, bus & taxi to CGN](#). From Bonn Central Station, the UN Campus can be reached by bus or subway (see directions below). For exact timetables, please refer to the SWB website [here](#).

By taxi: Taxis are readily available. A one-way journey to the city centre or the UN Campus costs between EUR 70 and 80. [More information about Cologne/Bonn Airport](#).

From Düsseldorf Airport: Take the SkyTrain to the station “Düsseldorf Flughafen”. From there, direct trains to Bonn Central Station leave every hour. For train departures, [check the website of the German railway](#). Type “Düsseldorf Flughafen” as the departure station and “Bonn Hbf” (Bonn Central Station) as the arrival station. A second-class train ticket costs around EUR 20–30 one way. From Bonn Central Station, the UN Campus can be reached by bus or subway (see directions below). From Frankfurt airport:

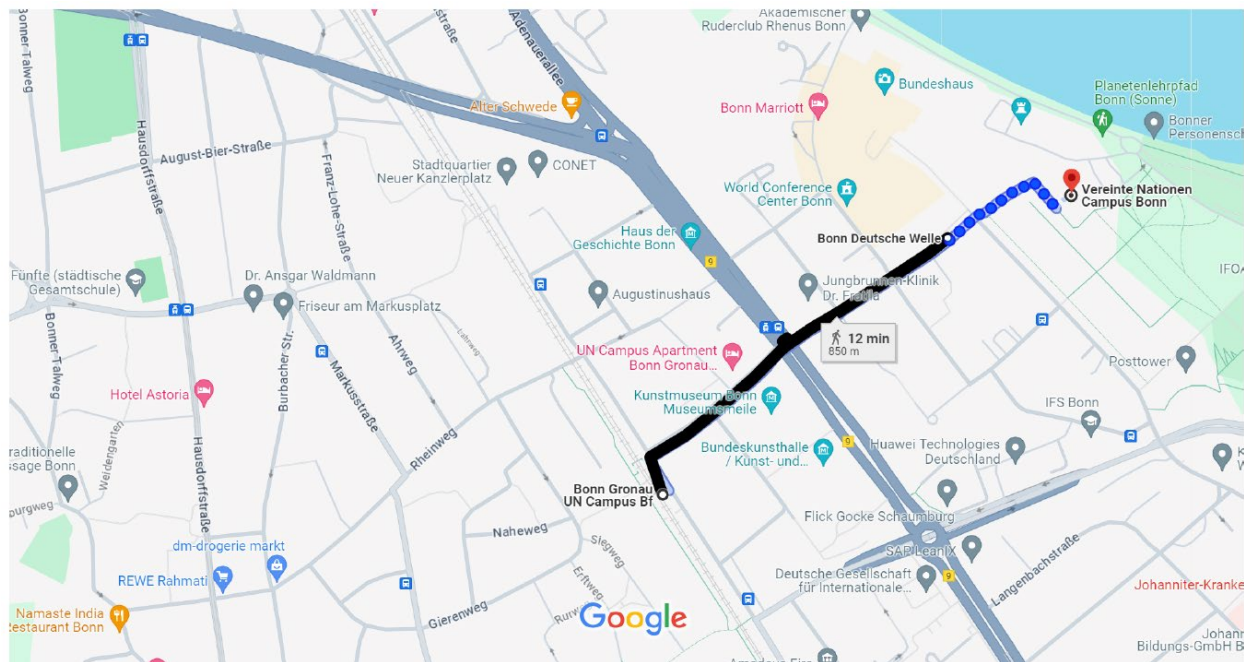
Go to Frankfurt Airport's long-distance train station by following the signs to "Frankfurt Flughafen Fernbahnhof". This station is located at the AIRail Terminal next to Terminal 1. Trains depart from platforms 4 to 7. You can travel either by high-speed Intercity Express (ICE) train to Siegburg/Bonn or by direct train to Bonn Hbf (Central Station). Both trains leave from Frankfurt Airport's long-distance train station two to three times every hour between 5 a.m. and 9 p.m. For exact train departures, [check the website of the German railway](#).

ICE to Siegburg/Bonn: The high-speed train journey takes 40 minutes, and trains leave at least once an hour. A second-class ticket costs around EUR 60–80 one way and can sometimes be booked together with your flight. From Siegburg/Bonn, you can reach Bonn city centre or the UN Campus by taxi (20–30 minutes) or subway line 66 (30–40 minutes). A one-way journey by taxi from Siegburg to Bonn costs approximately EUR 40.

Direct train to Bonn Central Station: The Intercity (IC)/Eurocity (EC) train, also leaving from Frankfurt Airport's long-distance train station, goes directly to Bonn Central Station. Travel time is between 1.5 and 2 hours. From Bonn Central Station, the UN Campus can be reached by bus or subway (see directions below). [More information on Frankfurt Airport](#).

Where is the meeting venue?

TEC 33 and the TEC–CTCN Advisory Board joint session will take place at the Langer Eugen building, conference room LE 2312 (23rd floor), UN Campus, Platz der Vereinten Nationen 1, Bonn, Germany.



Directions to UN Campus

By bus

From Bonn Central Station: Take bus number 610 or 611 (direction Heiderhof) at the bus terminal opposite the main train station. Get off at stop "Deutsche Welle".

From Bad Godesberg: Take bus number 610 or 611 (direction Bonn Hbf) at stop "Rheinallee" next to the train station.

Get off at the stop "Deutsche Welle". Walk down to Platz der Vereinten Nationen (towards the Rhine River) for about two minutes. The main entrance pavilion of the UN Campus is located in the middle of the intersection of Platz der Vereinten Nationen, Heussallee and Kurt-Schumacher-Strasse. The cost of a one-way ticket is approximately EUR 4.

By subway

From Bonn Central Station: Take subway ("U-Bahn") line 16, 63 or 66 (direction Bad Godesberg/Königswinter).

From Bad Godesberg: Take subway ("U-Bahn") line 16 or 63 (direction Bonn Hbf, Tannenbusch or Cologne).

Alight at the stop "Heussallee" and follow the signs for "Deutsche Welle/UN Campus". When you reach the street, go straight ahead until you reach the main entrance pavilion of the UN Campus. The distance from the subway station is about 250 metres. For the cost of a one-way ticket, please refer to the [ticket price list](#). Timetables for buses and subway can be found [here](#).

By railway:

From Bonn Hauptbahnhof (Central Station), take any regional train (RE, RB or S-Bahn) that stops at the new "UN Campus" train station, located approximately 800 m from the UN Campus main entrance.

By taxi

The fare for a taxi ride to the UN Campus (Platz der Vereinten Nationen 1) or WCCB (Platz der Vereinten Nationen 2) from Bonn city centre, Bonn Central Station or Bad Godesberg is around EUR 10–15. The central phone number for Bonn taxis is +49 228 555 555.

Langer Eugen Building

At the front gate, please identify yourself as a meeting participant for the 33rd TEC meeting. You will be asked to show identification and go through security. After the security check, follow the signs to the meeting room in the second building on your right.



Where can I collect my conference badge?

Facts about Germany

- **Time Zone:** Germany observes **Central European Summer Time (CEST) (GMT/UTC +2)** during the summer months and **Central European Time (CET) (GMT/UTC +1)** during the winter months.
- **Currency:** Germany is a member of the **Eurozone** and uses the **euro (€)** as its official currency. One euro is divided into **100 cents**. Euro coins are available in denominations of **1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 cents**, as well as **€1 and €2**. Euro banknotes are issued in denominations ranging from **€5 to €500**.
- **Country Code:** The international telephone country code for Germany is **+49**.
- **Internet Domain:** Germany's country code top-level domain (ccTLD) is **.de**, one of the most widely used internet domain extensions in the world.

Practical Information

- **Power Supply:** Electricity in Germany is supplied at **230 volts (V)** and **50 hertz (Hz)**. Standard European two-pin plugs (Types C and F) are used.



- **Time Zone:** Germany operates on **Central European Summer Time (CEST, UTC+2)** during daylight saving time and **Central European Time (CET, UTC+1)** during the winter months.
- **Climate:** Germany has a **temperate climate**, characterized by moderate seasonal variations and generally mild weather conditions.
- **Average temperature in September:** In September, temperatures in Bonn are typically mild and comfortable. Average daytime temperatures range from approximately **17°C to 21°C (64°F to 71°F)**, while nighttime temperatures generally range from **9°C to 12°C (49°F to 54°F)**. Temperatures may occasionally fall below or rise above these averages.
